REVIEW PANEL ORDER

Having heard Mr. James Diedericks and Gilroy Kasper for the Applicant, Mr. Festus Hamukwaya for the Respondent, and other interested parties who were in attendance, and having read the application for review and other documents filed of record:

Whereas the Review Panel noted the submissions made during the hearing and subsequently

- 1. That members of the Bid Evaluation Committee of the 1st Respondent acted contrary to Section 52(9) read with Regulation 33(1)(q) when during the examination and
 - 1.1. The bidders were subjected to a qualification criteria, in stage 2 on technical compliance for submitting a letter of intent from a Namibian road transport company regardless of whether such bidder does not intend to use road transport
 - 1.2. When it only assessed bidders on road transport insurance (as confirmed by the BEC Chairperson) while the bid document makes provision for vehicles, vessels and rail wagons to be used.
- 2. That the 1st Respondent conducted the procurement process in relation to this bid in violation of Section 57 of the Public Procurement Act, 2015 (Act No. 15 of 2015) when it allowed for a debriefing with the Applicant during the Standstill period before an



- 3. That the 1st Respondent conducted the procurement process contrary to Section 35(14) of the Procurement Act read with regulation 38(2)(c) and (d), when the 1st Respondent at its own volition unilaterally extended the prescribed 7 day standstill period during
- 4. That the members of the Bid Evaluation Committee of the 1st Respondent scored bidders differently for same set of documents and evaluation criteria.

In the result the Review Panel make the following order:

- 1. That the application against the respondents is competent and upheld.
- 2. That the evaluation of the bids under consideration is unlawful and irregular and is set
- 3. That the extension of the 7 day standstill period and debriefing is unlawful and irregular.
- 4. That the notice and selection for award in favour of Coleman Transport (Pty) Ltd JV is unlawful and irregular and as a result, it is set aside.
- 5. In the premise and in accordance with Section 60(b), the 1st Respondent is hereby directed to re-evaluate the bid and proceed in a manner that is in compliance with the
