STANDARDIZED GUIDELINES FOR SECTION 81 OF THE PUBLIC PROCUREMENT

ACT, 2015: TRANSITIONAL PROVISIONS

The above subject matter refers.

Section 7(1)(i) of the Public Procurement Regulations, 2017 states;

"to issue authorised versions of the standardised bidding documents, standard forms of contracts, prequalification documents, procedural forms, requests for proposals and other similar documents for mandatory use by every public entity implementing procurement;."

The Procurement Policy Unit pursuant to Section 81 of the Public Procurement Act, 2015 hereby issues a Transitional Provision Guidance Note to assist Public Entities in the implementation of the Public Procurement Act, 2015. Public Entities should take note of the below listed critical provisions before proceeding with a bidding process effected by section 81 (2) of the Public Procurement Act, 2015;
